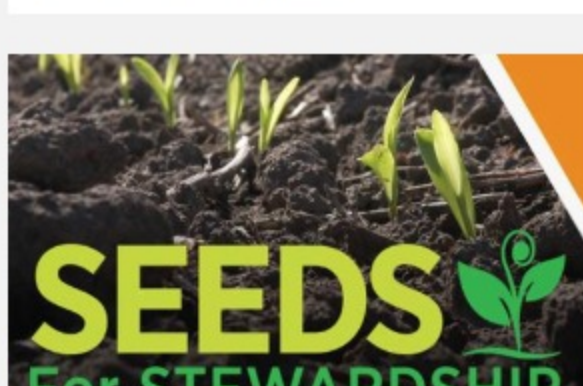
AgriSafe launches Nurse Scholars program
